- GPRS issues at maintenance level

 - M3UA still not completed in IETF



Items for PCG Attention

- Slow response from IANA
 - Code point registration needs to be speeded up (can take 6 months)
 - Problem often due to pointer to incomplete specs (IETF specs have been the problem)
- Hilite potential issue with IETF dependencies
 - IETF delivery dates not reliable
 - IETF does not have a focused workstyle
 - Prioritization and tight coordination being used



Items for PCG Attention (cont.)

- Liaision authorization requested to LIF
 - CN5 to coordinate with Location Interoperability Forum
 - www.locationforum.org
- OHG initiative on IMS harmonization
 - Generally a good idea but should not slow Rel5
 - Consistent responses from 3GPP & 3GPP2
 - Workshop planned for Q1 2002
