

- Concept can be extended to 3GSM in future








Connecting people to the world for the first time

- 6.5billion people in the world, only 2bn have access to communications
- In the least penetrated countries, mobile accounts for 60-90% of connections
- Mobile users outnumber fixed in more than 120 countries
- The next billion communication connections will be dominated by mobile



We must plan and cooperate as an industry to identify where economies of scale can be found to deliver to the equipment people require



Connecting people to new services for the first time



- Enhancing the delivery of services 3GSM roll-out
- 70 networks by the end of the year
- AT&T launch means 3GSM is now live on three continents with Africa to come by early 2005

Services

- Taking data services to new levels of quality with the seamless, secure and personal characteristics of the GSM family
- Encouraging the development of new services and encouraging new players in the value chain
- Embracing new revenue streams such as non-traffic services


3GSM networks launched Countries/territories on air Million 3GSM users 3GSM networks launched by end '04

NB:Economies of scale in 2GHz band make 3GSM increasingly viable option for developing economies.









- 3GSM is driving the emergence of high-speed mobile data connectivity

- First HSDPA launches expected 12 months






























- 275 million Chinese GSM users

 - sent 131 by text messages
