1. Overall Description:

GSMA SCaG is aware of the results of the CRs presented in 3GPP SA1 and 3GPP SA meetings regarding new requirements to support the creation, storage and management of MMS by the UICC applications.

Furthermore, this group is aware that the work items proposed in T3 about this subject have been rejected or postponed.

GSMA SCaG has been working on MMS management by the SIM card providing compelling use cases and requirements.

As it was discussed in SCaG #25, there is no valuable reason to stop these new features based on arguments like the ME/UICC interface speed or the available UICC memory, since all of these parameters are constantly progressing and the future availability of larger memories and faster protocols can be considered as a fact.

GSMA SCaG would like to encourage 3GPP to find the quickest path in order to incorporate these new features in Release 6 specifications, including storage, creation and processing of MMS in the UICC (in accordance with SCaG Use Cases of SC032_03).

To 3GPP SA1 :

SCaG would appreciate that 3GPP SA1 produce requirements to support all these new features.

To 3GPP T3:

SCaG would appreciate that 3GPP T3 start the corresponding standardization activities in order to satisfy these requirements.
