

You may need an NZeTA to travel to New Zealand for 3GPP SA6 #36

Our meeting hosts wishes to alert participants that New Zealand has recently introduced a system similar to the United States' ESTA required for travel. It is a new requirement for those travellers from countries and territories which do not need a visa for short-term travel to New Zealand. Such travellers must now have a **New Zealand Electronic Travel Authority (NZeTA)** before they travel to New Zealand.

Applying for the authority is straightforward and inexpensive. All visitors to New Zealand from visa-waiver countries and territories (see list below) must have an NZeTA.
