Subject: Call for RCM Experts for MCC task 160 on 3GPP UE ATS

Note: this letter may be of particular interest for your technical experts on 3GPP UE conformance test in TTCN

General

Nearly 800 test cases have been developed by MCC task 160 in TTCN for the R99 UE conformance and interoperability. Of these more than 100 FDD related high priority test cases, as defined by the Global Certification Forum, have been verified and approved by 3GPP. The ATSs have been developed as a software deliverable (TTCN) that is in full and active use by the 3GPP test industry. Careful and structured management of this suite is essential to ensure that the extant proven test cases continue to work whilst simultaneously integrating new verified test cases as well as the error fixes identified during the overall verification and regression testing process.

We are now recruiting for an ATS Release and Configuration Manager (RCM) to support MCC task 160 to ensure continued progress of the delivery of high priority test cases in 2004.

The Release and Configuration Manager (RCM) Expert

The expert will be answerable to 3GPP T WG1 Leadership in the first instance but will work as part of MCC task 160 and will, therefore, be entitled to the support provided by the ETSI Secretariat.

In broad terms the expert will be responsible for the management of timely deliveries of the ATS as required by 3GPP T WG1. The job tasks are as follows:

- 1. To create and manage a regime that allows regular releases of the 3GPP TTCN suite in accordance with the latest T WG1 Permanent Reference Document T1-12 "Process for Approval and Maintenance of TTCN". This is to include, but not necessarily limited to, the planning and implementation of:
 - A process to ensure that extant proven test cases continue to work with each release (both formal and informal).
 - A process to ensure that the 3rd party companies involved in the verification and proving of test cases, (known as 'contributing companies'), are able to track the changes through the entire life-cycle from CR through to integration into any public release of the ATS.
 - A regular cycle of conferences between the contributing companies to ensure the optimum exploitation of contributions as well as ensuring the identification of conflicts and the subsequent resolution.
- 2. To review, refine and manage the existing MCC task 160 procedures for Configuration Management, and to ensure that suitable procedures are defined, understood and implemented by all parties involved in the TTCN development and maintenance process.
- 3. To document and deliver all new procedures developed in a timely manner, such that they can be made available to MCC task 160, T WG1 Leadership and the contributing companies

4. To provide a status report, in the form of a presentation, to the T WG1 Plenary meetings and the TSG T Plenary meetings and on an 'as required' basis to the T WG1 Leadership.

Additional Information

The expert must have the strength of character, flexibility and necessary negotiating skills to remain focussed on the best interests of MCC task 160 and T WG1 when dealing with potential conflicts of interests between contributing companies. He or she should also be able to demonstrate a good track record in the operation of a configuration management process, and the verification and releasing of software products in a commercial environment. Please note that previous experience of involvement in standardisation is of less importance for this role.

The expert is expected to be based at the ETSI Headquarters in Sophia Antipolis for the duration of the secondment. Exceptionally, it may be acceptable for the expert to work from his or her parent company base for short periods, if agreed between the expert and T WG1 Leadership.

The initial contract is for an initial 6 month period starting on or around 26 January 2004 and will be extended to 31 December 2004 subject to performance as decided by T WG1 Leadership.

Considering the above information, we kindly ask you to propose candidatures to the ETSI Secretariat before **11 January 2004.** The candidature must include the Curriculum Vitae of the candidate in English, together with the completed questionnaire in Annex B1 (and B2 if applicable).

A short list of candidates will be set up in agreement with 3GPP TSG-T / T1 leadership. These candidates will be invited to attend a half-day Preparatory Meeting provisionally scheduled for 13 January 2004 to select the expert for the RCM.
